Main duties and responsibilities:

- To participate in departmental and faculty seminars aimed at sharing research outcomes and building interdisciplinary collaboration within and outside the department.
- To participate in the development, administration and marking of exams and other assessments.

- To provide pastoral care and support to students.
- To participate in the administration of the department's programmes of study and other activities as requested.
- To contribute to departmental, faculty, or LSST-wide working groups or committees as requested.
- To maintain own continuing professional development.
- To actively follow and promote all LSST policies.
- To maintain an awareness and observation of fire and health and safety regulations.
- To co-ordinate and maintain records of formative and summative assessments of students' learning carried out by the subject/course team.
- To assist in the production of an annual self-assessment action plan and regular course reviews to report on implementation to the appropriate manager.
